Taking the suhoor (pre-dawn meal)
Upon the authority of Anas ibn Maalik â \square Radhiyallahu anhu who said: The Prophet â \square Sallallahu Alaihi Was Salam said: $\hat{a}\square$ Take the suhoor for indeed in the suhoo there is barakah (blessings) $\hat{a}\square$

Upon the authority of Amr Ibnil \hat{a}_{\square} Aas -Radhiyallahu \hat{a}_{\square} annu who said: \hat{a}_{\square} The difference between our fast and the fast of the people of the book is eating at the time of Suhoor \hat{a}_{\square}

The best time for Suhoor

The best time for suhoor is the time the Messenger â∏ Sallallahu alaihi Was Salam took it.
Upon the authority of Zaid Ibn Thaabit \hat{a}_{\square} Radiyallahu anhu \hat{a}_{\square} who said \hat{a}_{\square} We took the Suhoor meal with the Prophet \hat{a}_{\square} Sallallahu alahi Was Salam then he stood to prayer so I said: \hat{a}_{\square} What was the amount of time between the adhan and the Sahoor? He said: \hat{a}_{\square} Approximately (the time it takes to recite) fifty verses \hat{a}_{\square}

The time of Iftaar
Upon the authority of Umar Ibn Al Khataab â \square Radhiyallahu anhu who said: â \square The Messenger of Allah â \square Sallallahu alaihi Was Salam said: â \square If the night approaches from here and the day disappears from here and the sun sets, then the fasting person has broken his fast (i.e that is the time for him to break the fast)â \square
(Agreed Upon)
the word â∏ hereâ∏ is clarifyed in the following narration
Upon the authority of Abdullah ibn Abi Aufaa â Radhiyallahu anhu who said: â We travelled with thte Messenger of Allah while he was fasting. So when the sun had set he said â Disembark and prefare food for us! (the term used is â fajnahâ which literally means to mix but is a reference to mixing milk or labn with water or mixing flour with water in the preparation of a meal) He (the companion) said: â Should we not wait until evening? â He said: â Disembark and prepare food for us! He (the companion) said: â But the day is still upon you! â he said: â Disembark and prepare food for us! as so he disembarked and prepared food for them. The Prophet â Sallallahu alaihi Was Salam then said: â If you see the night approach from here, then the fasting person has broken his fast (i.e. that is the time for him to break his fast) and he pointed with his finger towards the eastâ

Hastening to break the fast
Upon the authority of Sahl Ibn Saâ⊞ d who said that the Messenger of Allah â⊞ Sallallahu alaihi Was Salam said: â⊞ The people will not cease to be upon good as



long as they hasten to break their fastâ∏
(Agreed Upon)
It should be known that delaying the Iftaar is a characteristic of the people of the book!
Upon the authority of Abu Huraira who narratted from the Prophet â Sallallahu â Sallallahu â Sallallahu â The Religion will not cease to be manifest as long as the people hasten to break fast, since the Jews and the Christians delayâ

What the fasting person breaks his fast with
Upon the authority of Anas ibn Maalik who said \hat{a}_{\square} The Messenger of Allah \hat{a}_{\square} Sallallahu alaihi Was Salam used to break his fast upon fresh soft dates before praying, and if not fresh soft dates then dry dates, and if not then he would take some mouthfuls of water \hat{a}_{\square}

When he breaks it he says
Upon the authority of Marwaan Ibn Saalim who narrates from Ibn Umar who said the Messenger of Allah â Sallallahu Alaihi Was salam when he broke his fast he would say â Dhahaba Dhamaâ u wab tallatil â Urooqu Wa Thabatal Ajru Inshallah (The thirst has gone, the veins are moist, and the reward is established inshallah)

If he breaks his fast with someone who provides them food
Upon the authority of Anas Ibn Maalik that the messenger of Allah â Sallallahu Alaihi Was Salam went to Saâ dibn Ubaadah and he (Saâ dibn Ubaadah and he (Saâ dibn Ubaadah and oil then ate. Then the prophet â Sallallahu alaihi Was Salam said: â Aftara â dibn Indakum As Saaâ dibn imoon, Wa akala taâ dibn aamakumul abraar Wa Sallat alaikumul Malaaâ dibn ikah (May fasting people break their fasts with you, may the righteous eat your food and may the Angels supplicate for you)



The virtue of preparing food for fasting people even if it is little

Upon the authority of Zaid Ibn Khaalid Al Juhani â Radhiyallahu anhu who said: The Messenger of Allah â Sallallahu alaihi wa Salam â Whoever provides food for the fasting person to break his fast he has the like of his reward, without that depleting from the reward of the fasting person in the slightestâ

The fasting person avoids lewdness ,cursing and argumentation
Upon the authority of Abu Hurairah â \square Radhiyallahu â \square Anhu that the messenger â \square Sallallahu alaihi was salam said: If one of you sees his day fasting, then let him not utter lewdness or speak ignorantly, if someone attempts to curse or fight him he should say â \square Indeed I am fasting!â \square Indeed I am fasting!â \square
